



Full title: Joint Action on European Networks of Expertise Main areas: PREVENTION / EARLY DETECTION & SCREENING / DIAGNOSIS & TREATMENT / CARE & CARE ORGANIZATION / REHABILITATION / QUALITY OF LIFE / INEQUALITIES / PAEDIATRIC CANCERS / AI / RESEARCH Timeline: 01/11/2022 - 31/11/2024 (2 years)

• Sciensano and Unicancer held a joint meeting in Paris on 19th September 2023 to define the endorsement criteria for participation of centers, experts and healthcare providers in two future Networks of Expertise (NoEs) of the JANE JA : "Omics technologies" (Work package 9 led by Sciensano, BE) and "Hi-tech medical resources" (Work package 10 led by Unicancer and co-led by INCa, FR). Both Work packages worked on a table of synergies between their future NoEs and the other stakeholders or networks of the European and National ecosystem. The goal is to elaborate the future NoEs' position in the general landscape, in order to clarify their missions, to fill gaps and to avoid duplication. Sciensano also participated in the discussion of endorsement criteria for the network of expertise on Adolescents and young adults (AYAs) with cancers. The Work Package is lead by INT (Istituto Nazionale dei Tumori), Italy.



Full title: EU Joint Action on strengthening eHealth including telemedicine and remote monitoring for health care systems for cancer prevention and care Main areas: CARE & CARE ORGANIZATION / QUALITY OF LIFE Timeline: 15/09/202 - 15/09/2024 (2 years)

• Three randomized controlled trials exploring the role of teleconsultation and telemonitoring were set up in ten EU-member states and fifteen clinical centers. The main objective of the pilots is to explore the effect of eight weeks of teleconsultation program and telemonitoring of patient reported outcome measurement (including quality of life, pain and distress) compared to usual care among patients with breast cancer, head and neck cancer or any types of advanced cancer. • EUCAIM unveils first release of groundbreaking platform to fuel collaborative innovation and data sharing across Europe. The EUCAIM consortium and the European Commission are excited to announce the first public release of its platform, Cancer Image Europe, marking a major milestone in the project's development and an exciting step towards achieving its vision and goals. The first platform release brings benefits to researchers, clinicians and Al innovators across Europe and paves the way for the future of cancer diagnosis and treatment.

Key features and highlights of EUCAIM's first platform release include:

- A public catalogue of cancer imaging datasets from the repositories of the EU-funded AI for Health Imaging projects, following a common metadata schema.

- A federated searching tool to understand the information available in the federated providers.

- Full integration with the Life Science Login Authentication and Authorisation Infrastructure.

- Reusing and adding value to key components of EU-funded research projects and infrastructure in the field of cancer.



• **REMEDi4ALL is building a sustainable European innovation platform to enhance the repurposing of medicines for all.** The platform has the potential to bring down times and costs of drug development by focusing on already approved, discontinued, shelved or investigational therapeutics. The REMEDi4ALL consortium brings together a unique combination of expertise to address the complexities of drug repurposing. Under the leadership of EATRIS, the European infrastructure for translational medicines, 24 organizations in the fields of clinical and translational research, clinical operations, patient engagement and education, regulatory framework, funding, governance, Health Technology Assessment (HTA) and pricing and reimbursement will closely collaborate to make drug repurposing mainstream. This project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon Europe Research and Innovation programme under grant agreement N° 101057442.



The European Parliament voted for a revised air quality law on September 13, 2023, to create a clean and healthy environment for Europeans.




363 MEPs voted in favour, 226 opposed, and 46 abstained on the vote, which tightens the 2035 limit and target values for PM2.5, PM10, NO2, SO2, and O3. The new EU air quality rules would align with the latest WHO Air Quality Guidelines and protect human health, natural ecosystems, and biodiversity.



EOSC4Cancer had a consultation meeting on 17/10/2023 in Brussels to discuss their draft towards a roadmap to the federated digital infrastructure for advancing cancer research.



The meeting included presentations on the EHDS from DG SANTE and the Cancer Missions from DG RTD, followed by breakout sessions covering missing data types, missing data sources, national nodes and missing additional elements.



Cancer cases and deaths on the rise in the EU

New cancer cases rose by 2.3 % compared to 2020, to reach 2.74 million in 2022. Similarly, cancer deaths went up by 2.4 % compared to 2020, according to the European Commission's estimates published in the European Cancer Information System (ECIS).
