The NCPs are nominated by the national/regional authorities in EU Member States and Associated Countries to provide guidance, practical information and assistance on all aspects of participation in <u>Horizon Europe</u> funding programmes and open calls in their countries. In this meeting, we will also welcome the <u>National Focal Point</u> for Belgium, which covers <u>EU4Health</u> funding programmes.

Launch of the "AYA" project group with RIZIV/INAMI

On Monday, January 15, the project group "Adolescents and Young Adults" (AYA) was kicked off. The group, coordinated by Sciensano, will implement the agreement concluded between INAMI and 6 hospital establishments. Their goal is to finance AYA reference teams supporting tailor-made care for AYAs with cancer. The first year is dedicated to strengthening the expertise of the 6 reference teams and then devoting themselves to the mission of outreach to other hospitals and the front line during the following 4 years.

State of Health in the EU 2023: country health profiles now available

The European Commission, European Observatory on Health Systems and Policies, and OECD have published Country Health Profiles summarising the health and health systems of 27 EU Member States, Iceland, and Norway. The 'State of Health in the EU' cycle is a 2-year process initiated by the European Commission, designed to improve country-specific and EU-wide knowledge in the field of health. The 29 reports by the Observatory and the OECD are concise, policy-relevant profiles based on a transparent, consistent methodology that uses quantitative and qualitative data and is flexible to each EU Member State.
