# Kick-off of the new Joint Action Prevent Non-Communicable Diseases (JA PreventNCD)

The Joint Action Prevent Non-Communicable Diseases (JA PreventNCD), which held a kick-off meeting from February 13th to 15th in Oslo, is a new four years EU4Health Prevention project that aims to reduce the burden of cancer and other NCDs and common risk factors, both at a personal and societal level and support member states by taking a holistic approach for the prevention of cancer and other NCDs, through coordinated action. The JA will address health determinants common to cancer and other NCDs, and their common underlying risk factors. The Cancer Centre of Sciensano will lead the Work Package 10 "Identify individuals at risk", and co-lead the Work Package 4 "Sustainability". The Health Information service of Sciensano will also be part of the initiative, in the Work Packages 5 (Regulation and taxation), 8 (Monitoring), and 9 (Health in all policies).

### **CanScreen-ECIS project comes to a close**

The CanScreen-ECIS project, coordinated by scientists at the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), has concluded. The goal of the project was to develop and pilot a new cancer screening data management system to be integrated into the existing European Cancer Information System (ECIS) of the Joint Research Centre (JRC) of the European Commission.

On the 22nd and 23rd of February, a final dissemination workshop was held within the context of this project highlighting mainly:

- Utility of good quality data for monitoring of cancer screening
- How CanScreen-ECIS project aims to improve quality and reduce inequalities in cancer screening in Europe
- Value of performance indicators in programme monitoring
- Snapshot of cancer screening performance in selected EU countries
- Sustaining the project activities and discussing the project learning programme to improve quality of cancer screening in the EU.

Beating Cancer Inequalities in the EU Spotlight on Cancer Prevention and Early Detection

European Cancer Inequalities Registry



Cancer causes almost a quarter of all deaths in the EU27, Norway and Iceland, with five new cancer cases diagnosed every minute in 2022. Assessing and improving cancer care from prevention to treatment is essential for promoting longer, healthier lives. This report addresses the latest trends in cancer incidence and mortality in the EU and reviews key cancer risk factors, cancer screening programmes and early diagnoses, and issues in the provision of highquality cancer care. Country performance, crosscutting challenges and new developments are examined with a particular focus on disparities by regions, socio-economic status and gender. The report provides policy makers with fiscal, regulatory and health systems organisation tools, as well as examples of initiatives that can be undertaken in primary care, workplaces, and schools to better control cancer and counter inequalities.

### WHO publication | 16 January 2024 WHO global report on trends in prevalence of tobacco use 2000–2030

Progress in reducing tobacco use is a key indicator for measuring countries' efforts to implement the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control – target 3.a under the Sustainable Development Goals agenda. Countries have adopted this indicator to report progress also towards the tobacco reduction target under the Global Action Plan for the Prevention and Control of Noncommunicable Diseases 2013–2020 and the WHO's Global Programme of Work triple billions target. This report presents WHO estimates of tobacco use prevalence for 2022, numbers of users, and trends projected to 2030. Estimates are at global, regional and country-level.
